Holiday Spelling Activity Instructions

Each day of the week will have a different activity to practice spelling. You don't have to do the same page every day if you would like to switch it up! Everything is already created for you, so all you have to do is print what you need for the week and you're ready to teach.

For every week, you will need a copy of the Spin and Spell page and the Weekly Spelling Test for each student.

Suggested Use

- Monday: One copy of the Weekly Spelling List, the Spin and Spell page, a paperclip, and a pencil for each student
- Tuesday: One copy of the Word Boxes page for each student

Instructions:

- Pass out the Weekly Spelling List. Read the list of words together as a class and call on students to see if they know the meaning of each word. You can give them hints to look at prefixes, root words, or suffixes to help them find the meaning. This should be done before starting the activity.
- Pass out the Spin and Spell page, a paperclip, and a pencil (if your students don't already have one). Have the students follow the directions on the spinner when they land on a number.

Holiday Spelling Activity Instructions

- Wednesday: One copy of the Count the Syllables page for each student
- Thursday: One copy of the Synonyms and Antonyms page for each student
- Friday: One copy of the Weekly Spelling Test page for each student

Instructions:

- Read the list of words together and talk about the definitions again. Then have the students follow the directions on the page.
- Go over the word list one more time to remind the students of any difficult words before testing. If you wish, you can simply read the words off of the Weekly Spelling List, or you can add the definitions or sentences with each word.

Teacher Spelling Words
1. Irish - having to do with Ireland, or its people, culture, or language
2. jig - a lively dance
3. Ireland - an island in western Europe
4. magical - having or seeming to have the power to make impossible things happen
5. celebrate - to make special or honor with gifts, parties, or activities
6. shamrock - small, green leaves are divided into three heart-shaped parts
7. parade - a public celebration that includes people moving in order down a street by walking or riding
8. beard - the hair that grows on a man's face often not including the mustache
9. horseshoe - a protective iron plate that is nailed to the rim of a horse's hoof
10. treasure - wealth (as money or jewels) stored up or held in reserve

Challenge Words:
1. leprechaun - A leprechaun is a type of fairy from Irish folklore, like a gnome or an elf
2. emerald - a rich dark or yellowish green color
3. charming - the ability to attract, delight, and please
