COLOR LESSON
THE COLOR GREEN

You will need:

- Color Green Worksheets
- Green Items Colored Picture Page
- Green Crayons

Instructions:

Have the students come to the floor and ask the students if they can tell you what is green. Discuss this as a class. Show the class the green items picture and ask the students what color the items in the picture are. Ask each student what each item on the picture is and they are all green. Next, practice spelling "green" by saying the letter and have the class tell you "G", then "R", then two "E"s, then "N": "G-R-E-E-N." Have the students go back to their seats and hand out the worksheets for the color green. Go over the directions of each worksheet as a class and hand them out. Walk around and assist students as they work.

COLOR LESSON
THE COLOR YELLOW

You will need:

- The Color Yellow Worksheets
- Yellow Items Colored Picture Page
- Yellow Crayons

Instructions:

- Have the students come to the floor and ask the students if they can tell you what is yellow. Discuss this as a class. Show the class the yellow items picture and ask the students what color the items in the picture are. Ask each student what each item on the picture is and they are all yellow. Next, practice spelling "yellow" by saying the letter and have the class tell you "Y", then "E", then two "L"s, then "O", then "W": "Y-E-L-L-O-W." Have the students go back to their seats and hand out the worksheets for the color yellow. Go over the directions of each worksheet as a class and hand them out. Walk around and assist students as they work.

COLOR LESSON
THE COLOR RED

You will need:

 - The Color Red Worksheets
 - Red Items Colored Picture Page
 - Red Crayons

Instructions:

 - Have the students come to the floor and ask the students if they can tell you what is red. Discuss this as a class. Show the class the red items picture and ask the students what color the items in the picture are. Ask each student what each item on the picture is and they are all red. Next, practice spelling "Red" as a class. Say the word and have the class sound out the word. First is "R", then "E", and the last letter is "d". Practice spelling "Red" as a class. Have the students go back to their seats and hand out the worksheets for the color red. Go over the directions of each worksheet as a class and hand them out. Walk around and assist students as they work.

COLOR LESSON
THE COLOR BLUE

You will need:

 - The Color Blue Worksheets
 - Blue Items Colored Picture Page
 - Blue Crayons

Instructions:


 - Have the students come to the floor for the mini lesson. Ask the students if they can tell you some things that are blue. Discuss this as a class. Show the class the blue items picture. Ask the students what color the items in the picture are (blue). Go over the directions of each worksheet as a class and hand them out. Walk around and remind them that they are all blue. Next, practice spelling "Blue" as a class. Point to each letter and have the class tell you what they are. First is "B", then "L", then "U", then "E". Practice spelling "Blue" as a class. Have the students go back to their seats and hand out the worksheets for the color blue (one at a time, and hand out the next as students finish). Go over the directions of each worksheet as a class as you hand them out. Walk around and assist students as they work.
