
Pig Practice

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MULTIPLE LESSON PLANS

We have included easy-to-follow lesson plans to walk you through all of the capitalization and end-mark activities.

ELA LESSON Exclamation Points

Exclamation Points worksheet for the students (Shout It Out)

Have the students come to the floor. Ask the students to share their responses.

Explain to them that an emotion is someone's inner feeling. When we are reading something it can sometimes be hard to understand the words. Explain that we can use an exclamation point to convey strong emotions within our text. Give examples of strong emotions that may need an exclamation point.

Anger
Shock
Scared
Happy
Excited

Have the students go back to their seats and write their responses. Give them the opportunity to write their questions (gauge the time needed) and help students with their responses.

Hand out the "Shout It Out" worksheet to the students as needed.

When the students are done with the worksheet, take turns reciting the sentences and help them convey the emotion using an exclamation point.

ELA LESSON Capitalization

You will need:

- Things to Capitalize poster
- Capitalization worksheet
- Sentences, More Fixing Capitalization Practice

Instructions:

- Bring students to the floor and explain that a sentence is supposed to begin with a capital letter.
- Review the **Things to Capitalize** poster.
- Review that the first letter of the sentence should be capitalized. **ALL** sentences begin with a capital letter.
- Ask students how a sentence is supposed to begin.
- Review that every sentence must end with a period (.) but can also be a question mark (?) or an exclamation point (!) if the sentence is a question or a statement of strong emotion.
- Choose which capitalization worksheet to hand out to the students as needed.
- Capitalization Practice #1-5 Worksheets can be used to practice their capitalization skills.

ELA LESSON Periods

You will need:

- Period worksheets for the students
- Summer Thing Posters

Instructions:

- Have the students come to the floor. Ask them to share their responses.
- Tell them that a statement is a sentence that is not a question or an opinion.
- Have the students go back to their seats and write their responses. Give them the opportunity to write their questions (gauge the time needed) and help students with their responses.
- Tell the students they will be repeating the worksheet. They will be making statements. Hand out the "Make a Splash" worksheet and assist students as needed.

ELA LESSON End Marks

You will need:

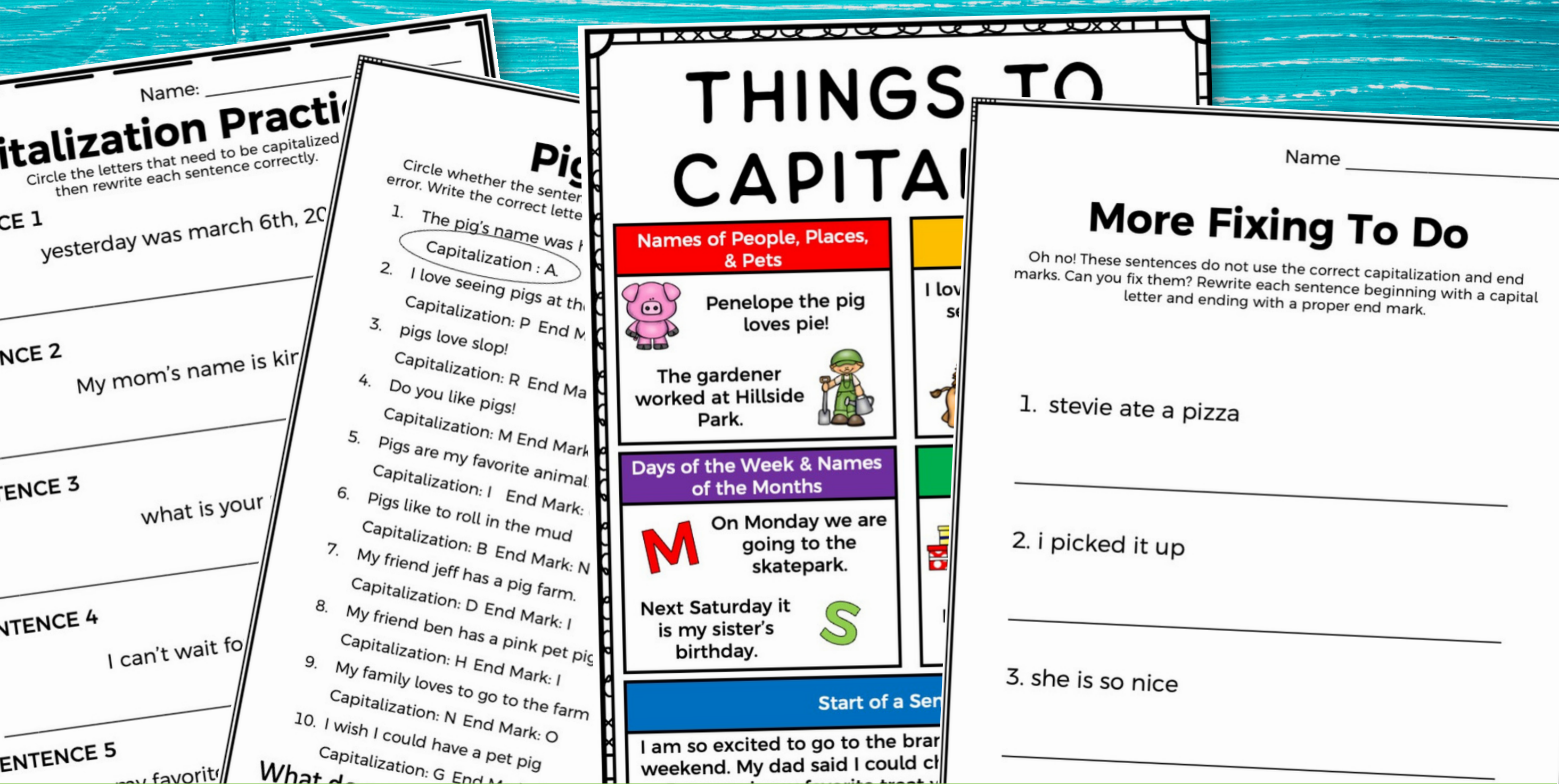
- End Mark Booklet for each student
- End Marks Poster

Instructions:

- Have the students come and sit on the carpet by the board. Ask the students if they can remember what they need to do at the end of a sentence.
- Discuss that an end mark needs to be used at the end of every sentence. Ask the students if they can remember the 3 different types of end marks (periods, question marks, and exclamation points).
- Review the **End Marks Poster** with the class.
- Give the following example and write it on the board (without an end mark). "The teacher walked to work" Ask the students what type of end mark should be used (a period). Ask the students when to use a period at the end of a sentence. Explain that a period is used at the end of a statement.
- Give the following example and write it on the board (without an end mark). "How many people are in your family" Ask the students what type of end mark should be used (a question mark). Ask the students when to use a question mark at the end of a sentence. Explain that a question mark is used at the end of a question.
- Give the following example and write it on the board (without an end mark). "Today is my birthday" Ask the students what type of end mark should be used (an exclamation point). Ask the students when to use an exclamation point at the end of a sentence. Explain that an exclamation point is used at the end of a statement of strong emotion.
- Ask the students if they have any questions.

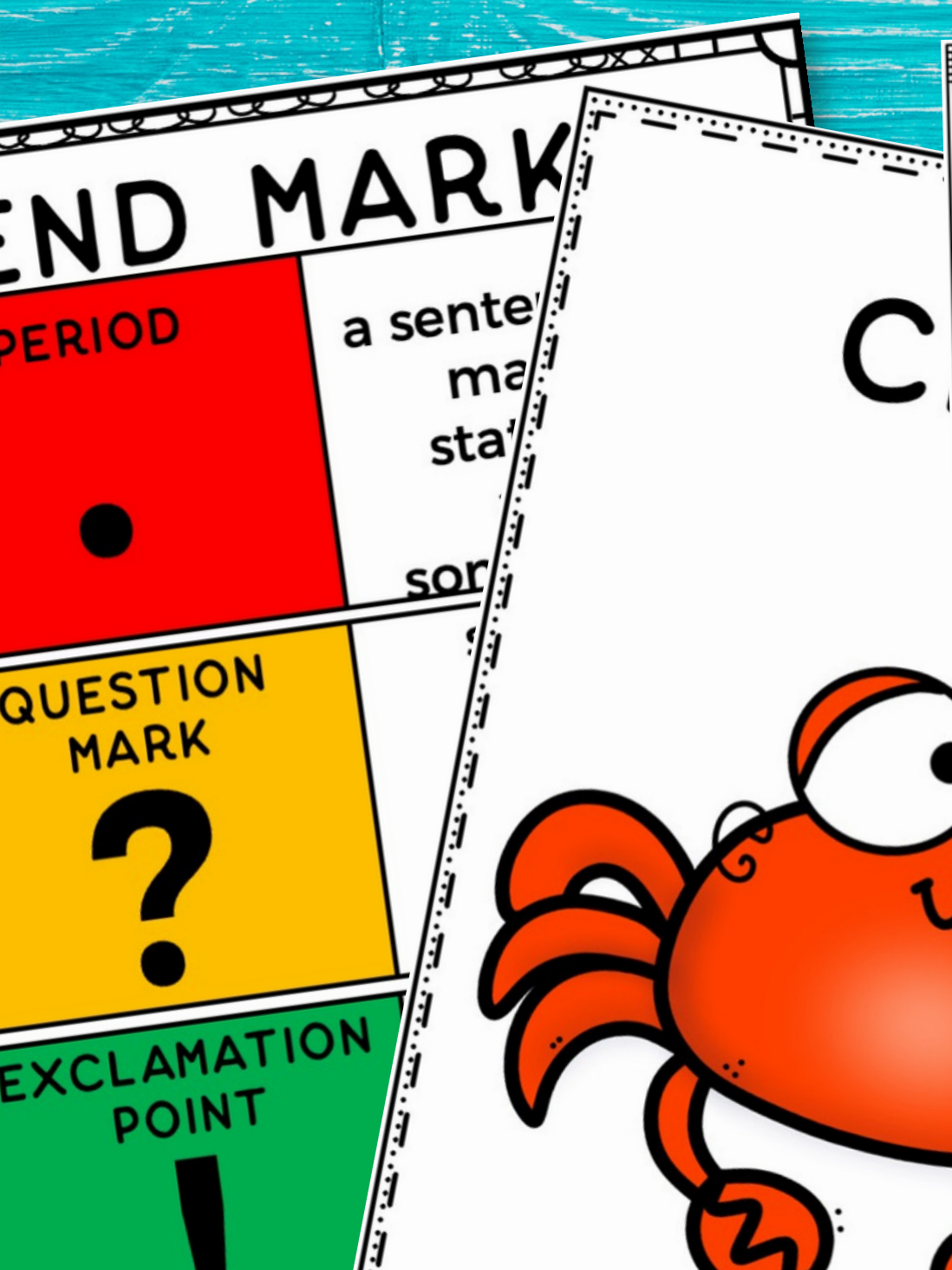


